Look at the tiny blade of grass just pushing its way through the hard ground to the sunlight. It is a very frail thing. Pull it up, and you will see that it has not power to stand alone. Even scrape the soil away from it as it stands in the earth, and it will at once lose its upright position. It depends upon the soil to hold it up, and yet it is pushing its way to the surface through that very hard soil. Dissect it as carefully as you please, and you will find nothing to indicate the possession of power. Rub it between your fingers, and you will see that there is scarcely any substance to it. It is about as frail a thing as there is in nature, and yet it will often remove quite large stones that are in the way of its growth.

Whence comes this power? It is not inherent in the grass, but is nothing less than the power of the life of God, working according to His word, which in the beginning said, "Let the earth bring forth grass."

We have seen that in every created thing the power of God is manifested. And we also learned from the Scripture that the gospel is "the power of God unto salvation." God's power is ever the same, for the text before us speaks of "His eternal power" (Rom. 1:20). The power, therefore, which is manifested in the things which God has made is the same power that works in the hearts of men to save them from sin and death. Therefore we may be assured that God has constituted every portion of His universe a preacher of the gospel. So then men may not only know the fact of God's existence from the things which He has made, but they may know His eternal power to save them.

How is it that if God has so clearly revealed Himself and His truth, there are so many who are in utter ignorance of Him? The names of the wicked do not remain in the book of life; they are written in the earth; for all their hopes and affections have clung to earthly things.

hearts are the dwelling-place of the Most High and whose lives show forth His character, come up in the heavenly court, Jesus Christ the righteous will be their Advocate. 
not served God will by default be set aside. There will be no one to present them. They have no advocate in the heavenly court. Sad indeed will be the state

of those who have started on the heavenly way, but after experiencing the joy of sins forgiven and the peace of God When the cases of all whose in the heart, have returned to the world and its follies. Their names have been written in the book of life, and their cases will be presented, but only to have the sentence, "Unfaithful," passed upon them, and their names blotted forever from the book of life.

> When the Saviour comes in the clouds of heaven, he will give reward to the righteous; but final judgment upon the wicked cannot yet be executed, for all are to be judged "out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works."

During the thousand years following the second advent of Christ to the earth, the righteous will join with Christ in judging the wicked. Then the justice of God in condemning the wicked will be demonstrated before all. (Revelation 20:4-6).

been guilty of cherished sins covered from the view of their fellow men, the awfulness of sin and the longsuffering of God will be appreciated by all.

The Saviour said that those who had followed Him while here on earth would judge the twelve tribes of Israel (Matthew 19:28). sesame tofu and greens salad



Serving size is 1/2 of recipe: 520 calories; 29 g fat; 12 g fiber; 37 g carbohydrates; 35 g protein; 600 sodium

- 1 bunch of kale, ribs removed
- 1/2 lb. baby spinach
- 1 (14oz) package extra-firm tofu
- 2 Tbsp sesame seeds
- 2 tsp peanut oil
- 1 bunch scallions, sliced
- 1 1/2 Tbs tahini
- 1 1/2 Tbs soy sauce
- 1 Tbs lemon juice
- 1 tsp sesame oil
- 1 clove garlic, finely minced
- 1 tsp honey
- 1. Stir kale into a large pot of boiling water, cook about 2 minutes, just until tender; stir in the spinach and remove from heat; drain and rinse under cold water to cool; squeeze to remove water; chop
- 2. Cut the tofu into 10 slabs; pat sesame seeds into the tofu; saute in peanut oil until browned, 4 to 5 minutes; stir in the scallions, remove from heat
- 3. Whisk the remaining ingredients together with 1 Tbs water to make a dressing, toss with greens, top with tofu and serve. Makes 2 servings.

Bone Health

How much calcium do we need for bone healh? Should we take vitamin D and, if yes, how much? Should we take drugs to prevent osteoporosis? News reports about these questions have confused many people, including doctors.

Back in 2008 three researchers reported that taking calcium supplements increased the risk of heart attack. Those claims made big news in the media and caused a wave of additional research.

In 2015 a meta-analysis was conducted that showed that there was no correlation between increased heart attacks and the consumption of between 600mg to 1500mg of calcium per day.

However, studies have also shown that consumption of calcium supplements alone does not reduce fracture rates. Calcium needs vitamin D in order to be effective at reducing fractures. The Women's Health Initiative study showed a 29 percent reduction of risk for hip fractures in women who were more than 5 years post-menopausal who took both calcium and vitamin D.

Women who were pre-menopausal or less than 5 years postmenopausal were unresponsive to calcium supplementation even with vitamin D. The reason has to do the levels of estrogen. When estrogen levels drop naturally, the body breaks down bone to maintain levels of calcium in the blood, and extra dietary calcium is not absorbed.

Vitamin D does more than just help calcium get into the bones. It also helps type 2 muscle fibers perform effeciently. These muscle fibers are the "rapid responders" when you get off balance, and tighten to help prevent you from falling.

Testing for vitamin D levels has increased in the last few years. How important is this test and should you have it done? The International Osteoporosis Foundation guidelines say that most people do not need to get their vitamin D levels tested. We just need to aim for taking in between 800 IU to 1000 IU per day of vitamin D. If you are active outside in the sunshine, supplementation may not be necessary.

An Australian study conducted on 2250 women who received a single oral dose of 500,000 IU of vitamin D annually, had a 15 percent higher risk of falls, and thus hip fracrtures.

What about exercise? Does it help build bone? It depends on the type of exercise. High impact weight-bearing exercise, such as jumping rope, hiking, basketball, or stair climbing done daily does build bone. Walking at a brisk pace, using cross-country machines and stair climbers also help. Muscle-strengthening exercises, while they are important in helping to build and maintain muscle strength, do not contribute to bone strength.

Did You Know?

Foods derived from the cocoa bean, in particular dark chocolate, are heart-healthy. Harvard University Health team performed studies that indicate that the consumption of dark chocolate lowers the rates of heart attack, heart failure, and even death from heart disease. A recent study of 55,000 persons conducted by Harvard in Denmark indicates that dark chocolate also protects against atrial fibrillation. Atrial fibrillation raises a person's risk of heart failure, stroke, dementia, and death. These studies were conducted using dark, high cocoa content chocolate, not milk chocolate candy bars.
